As part of the validation process, the PNGEITI Validation team is now circulating the **final 2021 Annual Progress Report** to the PNGEITI MSG to **seek endorsement and approval** before submission to the International Secretariat.

This report fulfils the EITI Standard's mandatory requirement (Requirement 7.4) relating to the Review of the outcomes and impact of EITI implementation. The APR is intended help an EITI implementing country to critically assess its progress against the EITI requirements; and enable the MSG to monitor if it is achieving its own objectives for implementation as established in the MSG's work plan in delivering expected results <https://eiti.org/GN5>. The PNGEITI National Secretariat has consistently ensured that the MSG progressively fulfilled this requirement with the production of eight APR's covering the fiscal years 2014 to 2021 <http://www.pngeiti.org.pg/1923-2/>.

The APRs are usually endorsed annually in the Q4 MSG meetings, however due to the urgency in Validation requirements, we have been called to produce and endorse this report before April 2022. The International Secretariat has allowed a draft copy to be submitted in anticipation for the MSG to endorse the final version via online resolution.

The National Secretariat now calls on the **MSG to review and endorse this report by deadline CoB Friday 01st April** and provide endorsement via online response for receipting. **The National Secretariat will be submitting the final version on 5th April** therefore, due to the urgency of this endorsement, **any non-response to the report will be taken as in agreement and in endorsement.**
